INNOVATION GRANTS

A NEW WAY OF TEACHING MEANS A NEW WAY OF GRANTING

The Lindbergh Schools Foundation Innovation Grant program continued with the "rolling grants" for the 2021-22 school year. The fund continues to support grants for Lindbergh staff who propose innovative and engaging projects that take instruction and learning to the next level. Staff can apply for up to \$500 at any time during the year. The grants are reviewed weekly, and once approved, items are ordered and sent straight to classrooms. Since 2008, the Foundation has awarded more than 400 grants totaling more than \$157,000.

HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS WITH A HEART FOR SERVICE

The Foundation Junior Board is a group of young leaders who will identify and work on mission-critical initiatives.

This past school year the Foundation Junior Board:

- Held a free hot-cocoa event for the students at LHS, to help garner interest and spread the word about the Foundation Junior Board
- Worked with local businesses to have a Bake Sale at LHS -- with all proceeds going
 to the Lindbergh Lights the Way Summer Cafe program. The students raised enough funds
 to pay for a week's worth of groceries for 27 families!
- Volunteered at Foundation events, such as the Community Breakfast
- Learned the mechanics of managing a nonprofit created their own executive board, and ran their own meetings each month
- Created a club grant fund where LHS clubs can apply to receive funding for their club goals.
- Developed a team atmosphere, bonded, and worked together to better Lindbergh Schools.



In March of 2022, nearly 50 students applied to be a part of the 2022-23 Foundation Junior Board. The board expanded and accepted 31 students. These newest board members attended a retreat in July and have created their calendar for the upcoming school year.


