TEACHER GRANTS

The Lindbergh Schools Foundation continued its annual support of original, innovative teaching ideas, funding 65 grants in 2019, worth \$29,816.


The Lindbergh Schools Foundation teacher grant fund supports grants for Lindbergh Schools teachers who propose innovative and engaging classroom projects that elevate instruction and learning to the next level. Since 2008, the foundation has awarded 268 grants totaling more than \$114,000.



\$63,500 FOR LHS GRADUATES

SCHOLARSHIPS

In 2019, 57 students received a total of \$63,500 in scholarships to help them further their education. The original LSF General Scholarship is awarded each year to the student who, based on his or her application essay, has overcome the most significant challenges and hardships during high school. Additional scholarships are established by or in the name of former administrators, teachers, coaches and alumni.

More than 300 community members, volunteers, local businesses, alumni, Lindbergh Schools staff and current students attended the Foundation's inaugural Community Breakfast on Sept. 6, 2019. The event raised more than \$27,000 for the LHS Alumni Association, Lindbergh Lights the Way, History Alive, teacher grants and LHS scholarships.
